'Pulmonary hypertension in patients with sarcoidosis: A single-center experience' is another manuscript about pulmonary hypertension coming from Turkey by Kaptan Özen et al. Hope to see its contribution to the literature.

Soydan et al. from Turkey continue to add their experiences about radial artery endothelial functions in transradial coronary angiography according to different radial access sites. Key point is the importance of preservation of radial endothelial functions.
