Dear Readers.

We are pleased to share with you the 2023 Issue 3 (Volume 20, Issue 3, September 2023) of the Journal of Education and Research in Nursing.

The International Council of Nurses (ICN) announced "*Our Nurses. Our Future*" as the theme for International Nurses Day 2023. ICN stated that this campaign would shine the light on nurses and on a brighter future, moving nurses from invisible to invaluable in the eyes of policymakers, the public, and all those who make decisions affecting the delivery and financing of health care. In this context, it was emphasized in the ICN report that governments should evaluate the impact of policies on the nursing workforce and make commitments to invest in safe employment levels. In line with this, emphasis was placed on advocating for legislation and policies on evidence-based nurse employment, sharing research findings and best practices to raise awareness and create support for change. In addition to the benefits of using the study results in patient care, such as patient satisfaction by providing safe and high-quality patient care, reducing morbidity and morbidity, and reducing the length of hospital stay and repeated hospitalizations, it also has positive effects on planning nurse manpower, increasing nurse satisfaction, and reducing their burnout and empowering nurses. For this reason, high-quality and high-proof studies in nursing science are vital and imperative in the development of the nursing profession.

I am pleased to announce that our journal is indexed in the databases of Tubitak Ulakbim Medicine (2012), EBSCO (2017), CINAHL (2017), DOAJ (2021), GALE (2022), and CNKI (2022), and we are working to publish our journal within the framework of international academic publishing standards. The studies with a high level of evidence from you have been instrumental in achieving these goals, and we know how important the valuable contributions of our journal's stakeholders, our readers, editors, managing director, and advisory board members are.
